An examination by the army revealed last night that mysterious objects found on a lonely New Mexico ranch was a harmless high altitude weather balloon—not a grounded fiving disk. Ramey went on the air here last

night to announce the New Mex-ico discovery was not a flying disk. Newton said that when rigged up, the instrument "looks like a six-pointed stan, is silvery in ap-pearance and, rises in the air like

a' kite."
In Roswell, the discovery set off

a flurry of excitement.

Newton, who made the examimation, said some 80 weather sta-tions in the U.S. were using that type of balloon and that it could have come from any of them.
