

Quiz Grading Rubric

Each red check mark is worth one point. Add them up to make sure they agree with the total score indicated.

The grader may sometimes mark an X or circle something where you went wrong, or they may offer advice in parentheses; all this is for information only and does not affect the scoring.

Check marks are embellished in 3 ways:

1. Diagram and/or Description (D) – see above
2. Method (M) - This is for *any valid* Method that forms part of the Idea or Analysis steps.
3. Answer (A) - This is for the correct final Answer, including units and appropriate precision. You will lose $\frac{1}{2}$ point on an Answer (A) if either of the following occurred:
 - a) wrong units
 - b) inappropriate precision (you cannot lose more than one $\frac{1}{2}$ point due to precision on the test.)

Carry Through Error (CTE) - an incorrect Answer (A) or diagram (D) *may* be awarded the points if it resulted from the use of a previous erroneous answer. The directly preceding method (M) points must have been awarded and the previous erroneous answer should not have simplified the problem. CTE points are awarded at the discretion of the grader.
